Covid

Governors

We've had 4 candidates who have volunteered to be parent governors, thank you to those four. Today you should receive ballot papers and instructions. We have to make sure that we maintain confidentiality with the voting system so it's a little complicated.

You should have two ballot papers, one for each person with parental responsibility. Please do pass on a ballot paper to the other adult if they are not currently residing in the family home.

Place one cross for your preferred candidate then put the ballot paper in a blank white envelope (provided). Then put that white envelope in the brown envelope (provided) which should have a sticker. Complete the details on the sticker and return it to school. We can then be sure who has had a vote and we will take out the white envelope and put it in the ballot box so it is then anonymous when we do a count. If you aren't bothered about anonymity then feel free to just return your paper and post it in the ballot box.

Hope that all makes sense!!

The count will be in 10 working days which gives parents time to return a postal vote if needed.
