



## SMSC and British Values in Spanish

### At Woodside Primary, we aim to develop SMSC in Spanish by:

<b>Spiritual</b>	We support children to consider their own lives and the lives of other people as they learn about different cultures and traditions. Children develop a sense of fascination as they explore another language and culture. We develop persistence and resilience through the challenges children face when learning Spanish. MFL teaching fosters self-confidence and self-esteem, encouraging children to value and respect their own efforts and achievements and those of others. We encourage children to be creative and expressive in Spanish through providing their own thoughts and feelings
<b>Moral</b>	Children are encouraged to communicate with others in Spanish and express their own thoughts whilst considering others. Children are taught the value of respect through listening attentively to others and being polite. We also teach children to be kind when talking about other people and cultures. By discussing other cultures and way of life, we allow children to explore differences and discuss moral issues which arise.
<b>Social</b>	Encouraging and teaching children the necessary skills to work collaboratively and co-operate, both in English and Spanish. We aim to promote the importance of supporting others when learning how to communicate in another language. Children are encouraged to take part in conversations with others in various given scenarios, developing their confidence communicating in a range of different ways. We also highlight the positive impact of language learning and how it links to their own lives and future aspirations.
<b>Cultural</b>	Educating and improving our children's knowledge and understanding of other cultures and traditions in other countries. Children are taught the importance of respecting other cultures and are encouraged to make links between our own culture and other cultures. We aim to identify differences between cultures and foster a culture of mutual respect. We highlight the importance of being able to communicate with people from different places and the benefits of being able to communicate in another language, thereby creating links through language.

### At Woodside Primary, we aim to develop British Values in Spanish by:

<b>Democracy</b>	Children learn to take the views and opinions of others into account and take turns and instructions from others.
<b>Rule of Law</b>	In Spanish, learners examine different codes for living and consider the value of the rule of law where all people are equal before the law in this country and that of Spain.
<b>Individual Liberty</b>	Spanish develops further tolerance and harmony between different cultural traditions by enabling learners to acquire an appreciation of and respect for their own and other cultures.
<b>Tolerance of those with different Faiths and Beliefs</b>	Spanish can challenge learners to be increasingly respectful and to celebrate diversity of different cultures, faiths and beliefs. We provide learners with meaningful learning experiences that mean they are able to learn about different religions and beliefs within our school and wider community.
<b>Mutual Respect</b>	Our Spanish curriculum allows learners to foster mutual respect for others by providing learners with opportunities to learn about the views and beliefs of those from Spain. Learners will identify similarities and draw comparisons between different faiths.
