Please do consider getting PCR tests if you think there may be a chance that children or yourselves may be positive. Remember we have lots of LFD test kits in school if you need more for asymptomatic testing.

They have been very busy this week taking calls about illness and checking absence for those that haven't managed to ring. They will also be busy sending out free school meal vouchers for Christmas. Your vouchers should be emailed over the weekend and they work out as £20 per week per child.
